Reclamation Financial Assistance -General Grant Information



50% Project's cost and no more than \$5 million



States, tribes, irrigation and water districts, and other entities with water or power delivery authority



Awards made through a competitive process

Title XVI Program

Title XVI of P.L. 102-575, as amended, provides authority for Reclamation's water recycling and reuse program

- Authorized Projects: Congressionally authorized Title XVI Water Reclamation and Reuse projects
- **Feasibility Studies:** Studies to assist communities to determine whether water recycling and reuse projects are viable
- <u>Research Studies:</u> New funding opportunity to conduct water reclamation research under the Title XVI program
- Water Infrastructure Improvement for the Nation (WIIN) Act Funding for projects.

How do I get a grant? Tips:

- If you have a large project, consider breaking it into phases.
- Don't assume that the Grantor knows you.
- Focus on the Grant Evaluation Criteria. Copy them into your proposal and address each of them in your proposal.
- 50% of the non-federal funding cost-share can include state funding, or other sources other than federal.
- If you don't get a grant award, ask for a de-brief to help you prepare for next year or the next FOA.

Most importantly, Ask for help!
