




#### **Broad Representation Here Today**

SW = Stormwater, DW = Drinking Water, WW = Wastewater


### Messages on Current Funding

  - Always useful to have some funding that is flexible


Funding vs Finance

### Future Funding For Program Management?




### Messages of Future Funding

Heavy reliance on grants and loans, which are very competitive


Differences in capital vs operations costs and funding methods
